

Gouvernment de la jeunesse du Canada Youth from around the world are making tremendous contributions to their communities every day. Young people are carrying out important initiatives in almost all aspects of community development; from education to the environment and civic participation.

The Youth First Ministers conference brings youth leaders from across Canada and abroad together to foster new relationships and partnerships, provide a forum for youth to share experiences and discuss issues of importance, and for youth to

build and develop leadership skills while at the same time celebrating each others achievements.

The Youth First Ministers Conference, which is organized by the Youth-Government of Canada, alternates between the major cities across Canada each year to reflect the organizations national mandate. The Youth-Government of Canada is a collaboration of youth and youth organizations who aim to represent, serve, engage, or empower youth ages 10-24, and organizes this conference annually in collaboration with the local municipal youth cabinet.

NET WORK

The YFMC is an ample opportunity to network with other youth organizations, municipal youth cabinets, and provincial youth parliaments; to foster new partnerships and relationships; and to learn about the amazing initiatives and efforts led by youth from all across the country.

This year the Youth First Ministers Conference is being co-hosted by the Youth-Government of Canada, the Toronto Youth Cabinet, and Youth for Transparency International at York University and Toronto City Hall, from Friday, October 17 to Sunday, October 19. The conference will bring over 300 youth in the discussions of various topics via workshops, debates (moderated by Rick Mercer) and presentations. This conference will gain the attention of other youth organizations, media, and politicians from all levels of Government.
