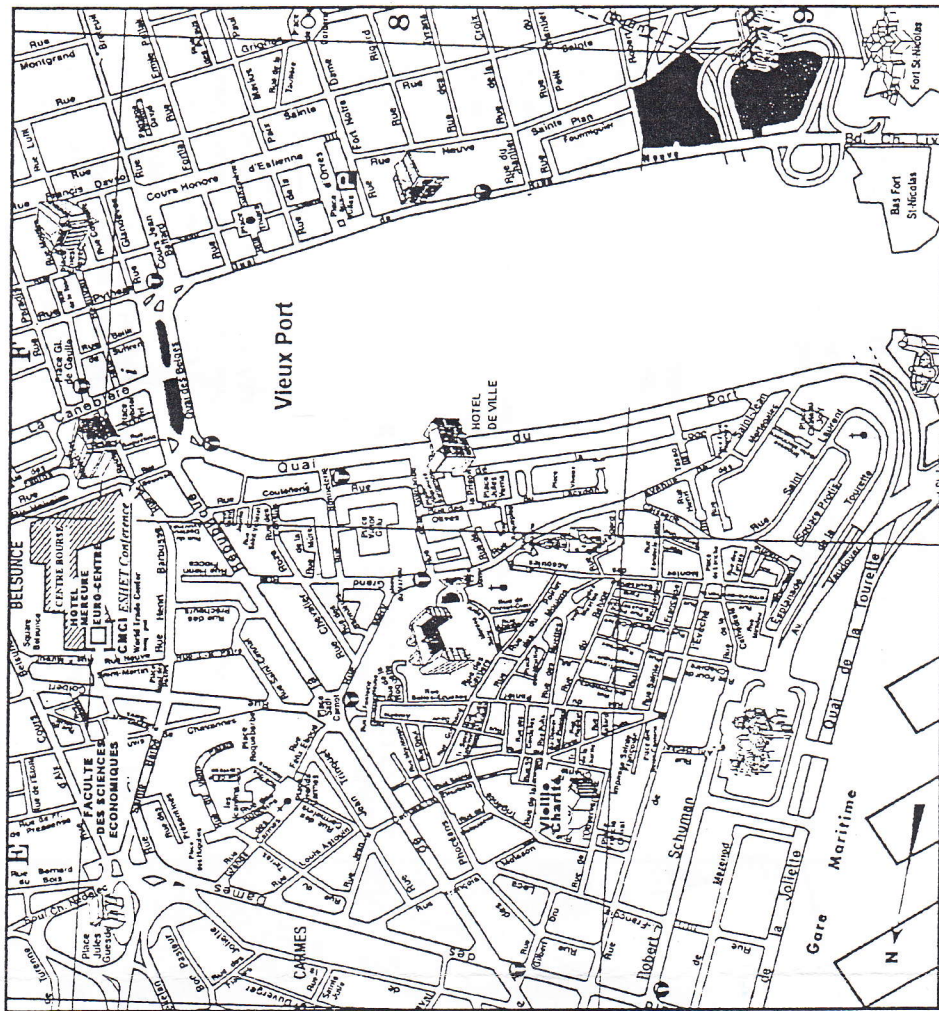


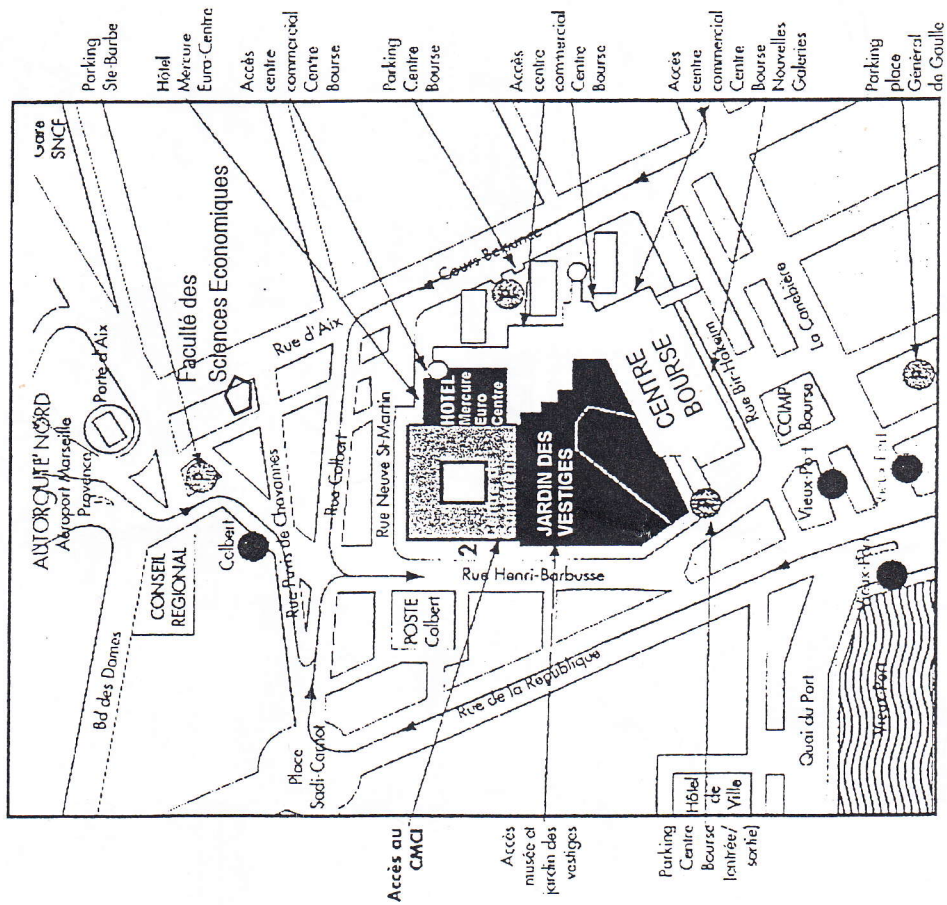

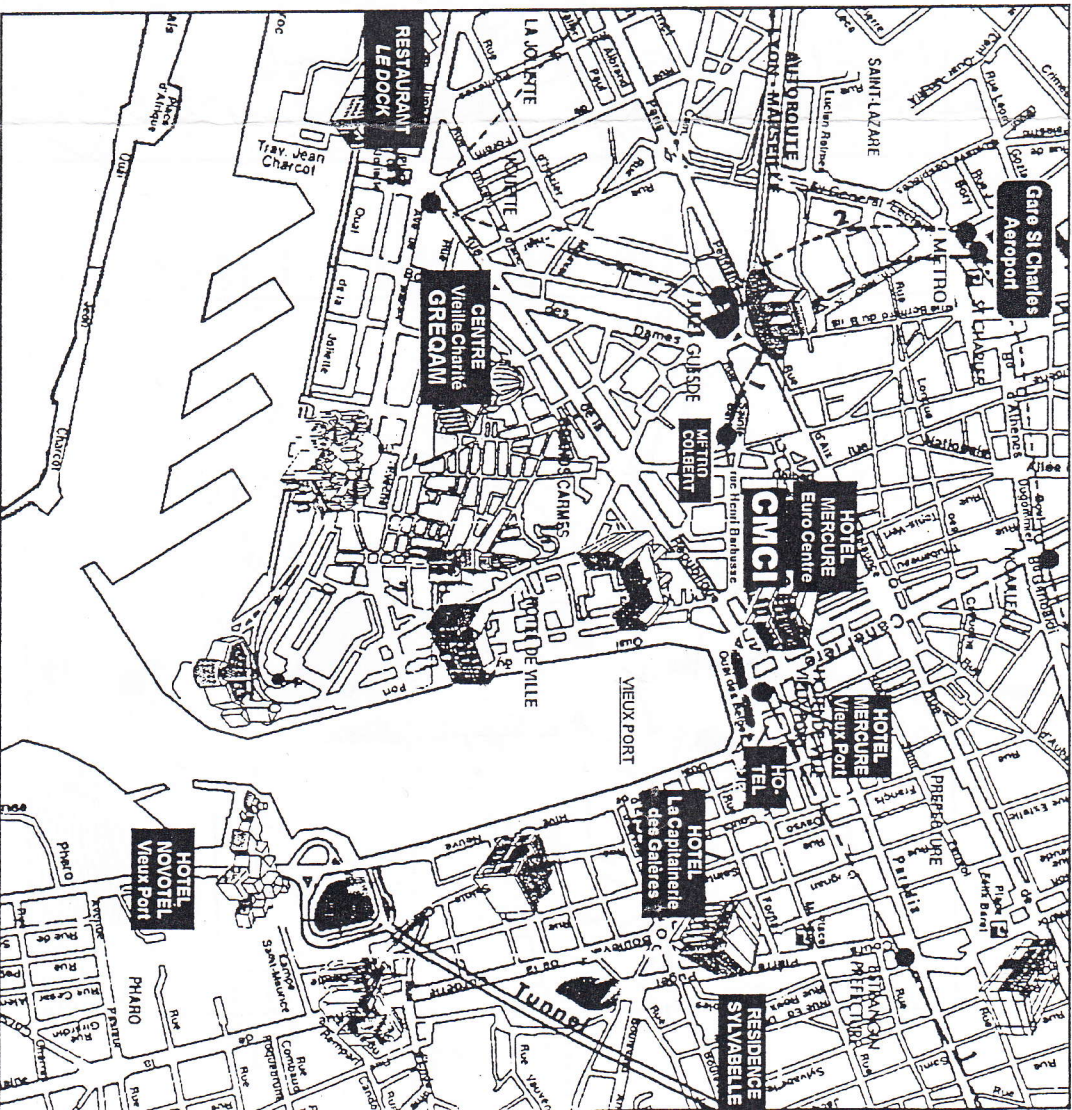

The other hotels are not far distant from CMC Conference Center, near to the "Vieux Port".

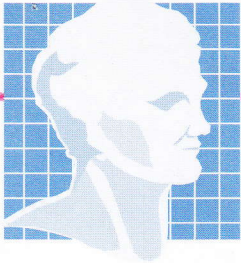

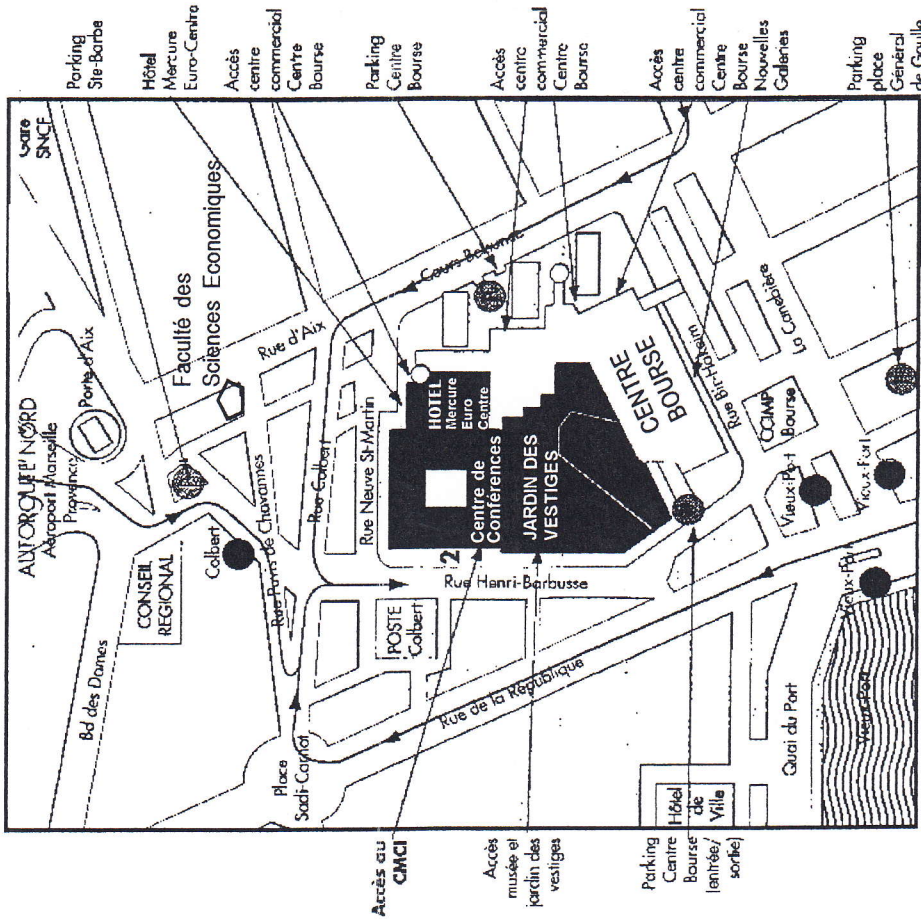
